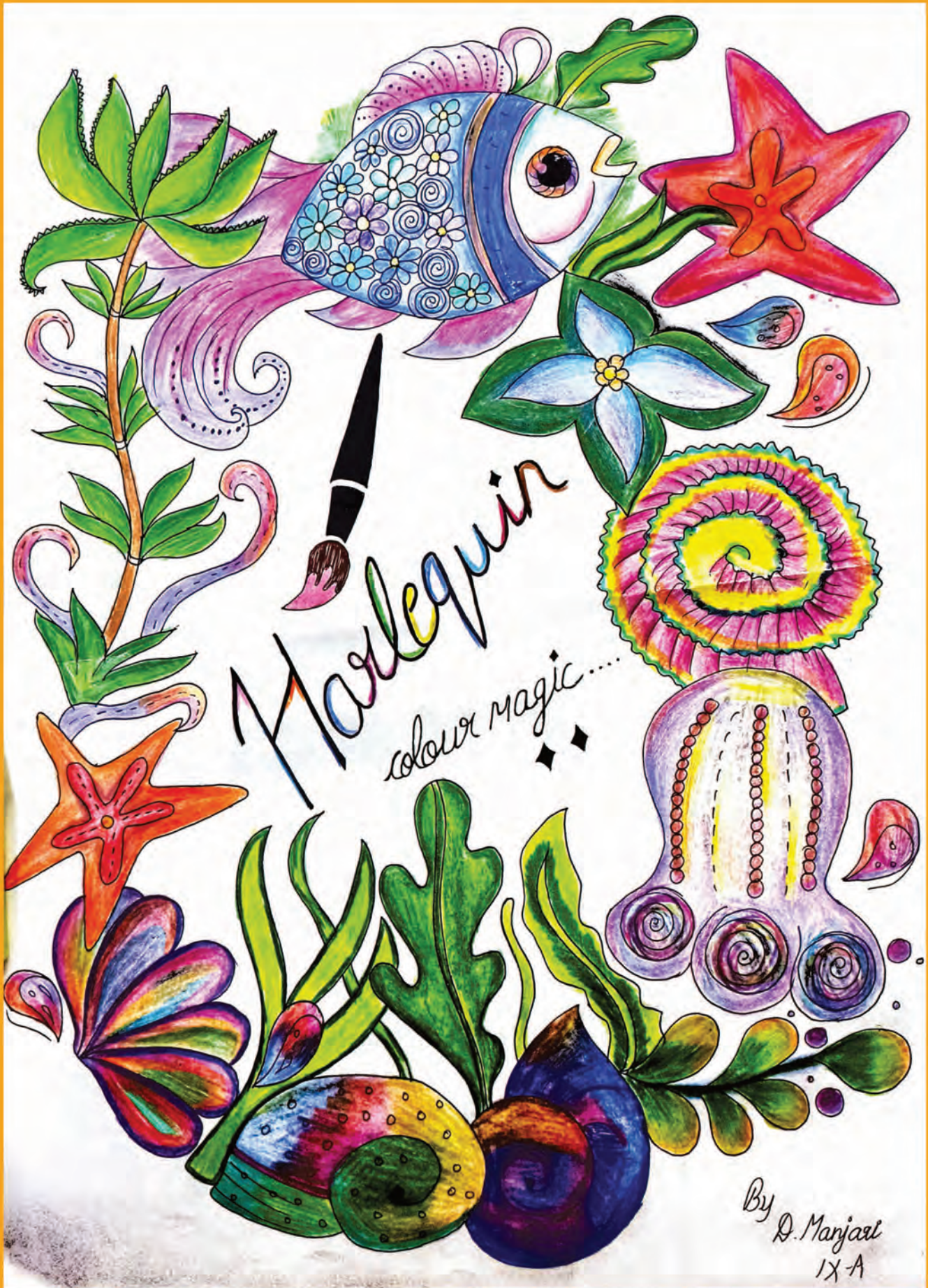

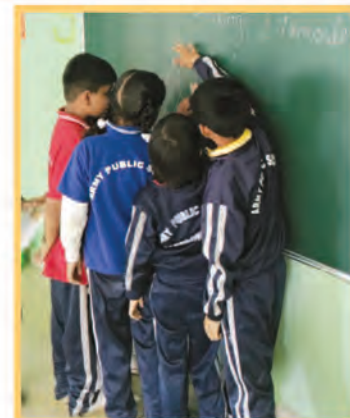
MATHEMATICS CLUB: MATHLETES
